




JARRETT KROSOCZKA

CCS 21st Walk-A-Thon

On Friday, November 7th, 2025, CCS will host its twenty first Walk-A-Thon (Rain date of Friday, November 14th)! The purpose of this event is to have fun, bring school and community together in an active and healthy way, and raise funds for a worthy cause.

The charitable organization selected to benefit from the Walk-A-Thon is Love for Meow. Half of the money raised by this year's Walk-A-Thon will go to Love for Meow.

The other half of the money raised will go toward each class's 8th grade class trip. If your child raises \$100, \$50 will be set aside for his or her 8th grade class trip. Typically, the 8th grade trip costs about \$1,000 per student. That number tends to be higher for smaller classes and lower for larger classes. Every 8th grade class does a lot of fundraising in addition to the Walk-A-Thon, though nine years of Walk-A-Thons often gives a class a great head start!

The walk will start at 1:00pm on Friday, November 7th. The students will be bused up Cream Hill to the intersection of Cream Hill/Cherry Hill/Cogswell Roads. Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grades will walk just shy of two miles, grades 3-4 will walk two and a half miles, and grades 5-8 will walk four miles (please refer to the map attached). When the students complete their walk, they will be bused back to the school for the remainder of the school day. If you are giving your permission for your middle School child/children to walk back down Cream Hill after their walk is done, please email Patty at the CCS office. If you are planning to join the walk and take your child/children home after the walk is completed, please email Patty that morning, and pick your child up from the school office after the walk is completed.

We welcome all and hope to see many of you on the day of the CCS Walk-A-Thon. Thank you for your support!



Brooker Memorial - Dental Hygienist

Brooker Memorial Dental Program Coming to CCS!

We're excited to share that Brooker Memorial's dental hygienist, Deb Ravlin, will be visiting Cornwall Consolidated School this month! Parents, please be sure to return your child's dental forms so they can receive their exam and cleaning right here at school!

Deb will be visiting two days each week, and the length of her stay will depend on how many students register for services.

All children in grades Pre-K through 8 are eligible to receive:

- Dental cleanings
- Fluoride treatments
- Oral health screenings
- Sealants

These services are available regardless of who your child's dentist is. Families are asked to provide dental insurance information so Brooker Memorial can bill insurance (they accept HUSKY) to help offset costs. If you don't have insurance, there is no cost to you—families will not be billed for services provided at school.

Brooker Memorial is thankful to the Foundation for Community Health for supporting the Region One In-School Dental Program. While the grant helps fund the program, it does not cover all expenses—your participation helps keep this valuable service available for all.







All students are eligible to receive breakfast each morning. The cost is \$2.00, unless your family qualifies for the free and reduced breakfast/lunch program.


Lunch is also available to all students for \$3.50, unless you are on the free and reduced program.




